ARC pilot project in Budget News

Four UKRI-funded pilot projects that will aid better and safer use of data in research were referenced by the Chancellor in the 2024 Budget, including the ARC-led "Fair Data Accelerator". This pilot seeks to develop and deliver ways to help all research communities make data more findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable (the FAIR principles).

The project, to be delivered by <u>UK SKA Regional Centre</u> and UCL, will use social science approaches to make the social and cultural challenges and barriers to data sharing, which are currently hidden, visible.

It will also pilot a FAIR Data Accelerator that can help make data sharing easier for researchers.

The Research Data Repository is 5 years old

It has been almost 5 years since we launched the <u>UCL</u>
<u>Research Data Repository</u> and we are inviting colleagues to share with us their thoughts on the service.

The survey can be found here.

The Research Data Repository gives all staff and research students the opportunity to deposit and preserve research outputs such as datasets, figures, posters, presentations, code, etc. for the longer-term here at UCL. To date, we have published hundreds of items issuing most of these with a DOI (digital object identifier) as part of a full data citation. The Research Data Repository can support colleagues in further engaging with the FAIR principles as part of the wider Open Science and Scholarship policy and practice.



The next Crick AI Club meeting is on **Friday 15th March from 17:15 - 20:45**, when Fernando PérezGarcía (Senior Machine Learning Engineer, Microsoft Research) will present "Multimodal AI for Improving Radiology Workflows".

Abstract: In this talk, I will present the latest research from the Biomedical Imaging group at Microsoft Research. I will introduce RAD-DINO, our image encoder trained using self-supervised learning without text supervision; MAIRA, our large multimodal model for radiology report generation from medical images; and RadEdit, our method for stress-testing biomedical vision models using diffusion image editing.
