From Split Households to Familization: Strategies of China's Rural-Urban Migrants

Professor Fan was born and raised in Hong Kong. She received her PhD from the Ohio State University and has been a Professor at UCLA since 1989. As Vice Provost, she is UCLA's senior international officer and is the first woman and Asian to hold that position. She is responsible for UCLA's global strategy and international partnerships and she oversees the International Institute.

Internationally known for her research on migration, regional development and gender in China, Professor Fan has numerous publications, including the book *China on the Move*, a pioneering study on rural-urban migration in China. She has also co-edited the international journals *Regional Studies* and *Eurasian Geography and Economics*. A frequent commentator for the *New York Times*, BBC, China Radio International and other media outlets, she has delivered numerous keynotes in the U.S., Europe, Asia, Africa and Australia. Professor Fan is a recipient of the UCLA Distinguished Teaching Award and major grants from the Henry Luce Foundation, Andrew Mellon Foundation and National Science Foundation.
