The IPM is a preparatory course for international students aiming to study for a postgraduate degree at a leading UK university.

Why study the IPM at UCL?

Time to prepare

Our nine-month course allows you the time you really need to take full advantage of English-language training, a discipline-specific focus and support in completing your postgraduate degree application.

Discipline-specific focus

Learn academic skills relevant to your subject area to fully prepare you for postgraduate study.

Tailored university application support

You will receive postgraduate application support from experts in the field, including the IPM team and a dedicated adviser.

This support includes detailed help with writing a personal statement in term one, leaving you with enough time to write your statement before making university applications early in term two.

Full university experience

We teach the IPM on our central London campus and use the same teaching methods as you'll encounter in postgraduate degrees. You're a UCL student from day one.

Join a welcoming, supportive environment of international students and staff, both on the IPM and in the wider-UCL community.

Overview

We've designed the IPM for international students aiming to study for a postgraduate degree at UCL or another top UK university.

This nine-month course is for you if you have an undergraduate degree that meets the academic requirements of your future degree, but you want to:

- enhance your academic ability and improve your English language level
- explore your academic interests and options for your future studies
- receive postgraduate application support from your teachers.

To ensure you are more academically confident and independent by the time you start your Master's degree, you will:

 be introduced to a new academic culture

• gain an insider's perspective on what it takes to be successful at UCL and



- Master's-style teaching methods such as lectures, classes, peer study groups, workshops, personal tutorials and self-study tasks.
- Using authentic academic situations and tasks you will encounter in your future degree.
- Teaching you on UCL's Bloomsbury campus in central London, helping you settle into living in a new country.



Course structure

The course is made up of three components.

- 1. English for Academic Purposes
- Research, Argumentation and Criticality
- Discipline-specific Research, Argumentation and Criticality

Component three options

You will choose one of the options below, in which you will further develop your research, critical and argumentation skills in your discipline (or one closely related to it).

- · Architecture and Urban Design
- Business, Economics, Management and Finance
- Education and Psychology
- · Humanities, Social and Political Sciences
- Law
- Life and Medical Sciences
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)

The qualification

The IPM indicates your English language level and academic skills for studying a Master's degree in the UK.

It can be used to fulfil UCL's English language requirement for postgraduate study but cannot be used to fulfil the academic requirement at UCL or other universities.

Applying

We recommend that you apply as early as possible.

Entry requirements

To be considered for the IPM, you will need to meet both our:

- · Academic entry requirements
- · English language entry requirements

Academic entry requirements

You must show that you have a strong academic background by having a minimum of a lower second-class degree (2:2) or an overseas equivalent.

English language requirements

You must show that your English is sufficient for the course.

Qualification	Scores

Your English language qualification must be no more than two years old by the IPM start date.

If you have completed a degree in a country that UCL considers to be "majority English-speaking", you may meet our English language requirements, please see our website for further information.

UCL postgraduate offer holders

If you hold an offer for a UCL postgraduate degree for 2025-26 entry and would like to start a year later so you can do the Pre-Master's, you will be able to request a deferral.

We will include further information about how to request a deferral in our IPM enrolment letter, after you have paid the tuition fee in full.

You must make your deferral request at least two weeks before the start date of the postgraduate degree you had applied to, and be deferring for the first time.



Once you've accepted your IPM offer and have received your student number, you can apply for UCL accommodation.

You must apply before the undergraduate accommodation deadline to be considered.
