Undergraduate Preparatory Certificates (UPC)

Why study the UPC at UCL?

Full university experience

We teach the UPC on UCL's Bloomsbury campus. You'll be a UCL student from day one and can take advantage of UCL's academic, social and welfare resources.

Join societies and sports teams at Students' Union UCL and experience student life in London first-hand.

Personalised support

You will receive a one-to-one tutorial every week with your personal tutor, as well as regular support from a student mentor and a dedicated education advisor.

Quality teaching

You'll be taught by experienced UCL academic staff who are experts in preparing international students for undergraduate studies.

For compulsory subjects, you'll typically be taught in seminar groups of no more than 14 students.

You will be joining a welcoming and supportive environment of international students and staff, both on the UPC and in the wider-UCL community.

Overview

Undergraduate Preparatory Certificates (UPC) are intensive and challenging foundation courses for international students whose school qualifications do not allow direct admission to an undergraduate programme.

The UPC provides students with the essential academic and language skills, knowledge and support to progress confidently and smoothly onto an undergraduate degree at UCL or another top UK university.

There are two undergraduate foundation courses at UCL:

- Humanities (UPCH)
- Science & Engineering (UPCSE)

During one academic year (September – June), the courses provide outstanding preparation for the academic challenges of a top UK degree programme.

Course structure

You will study four subjects:

- two compulsory subjects
- two optional subjects

Compulsory subjects

You will study two compulsory subjects:

- Academic English
- Academic Research: Approaches & Methods (UPCH students)
- Science & Society (UPCSE students)



If you are a proficient user of English and have an IELTS for UKVI (Academic) score of 7.5 (overall and in each section), or equivalent, you can study another language instead of taking Academic English.

Languages offered have included: Arabic, Dutch, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Mandarin, Portuguese and Spanish.

Optional subjects

In addition to the compulsory subjects, you will select two optional subjects.

The optional subjects are selected according to the requirements of the undergraduate programme you are aiming for.

- Classical Civilisation: Literature, Philosophy and Politics
- Economics
- Geography & the Built Environment
- Mathematics
- Modern European Culture
- Modern European History & Politics

UPCSE: Optional subjects

- Physics

Entry requirements

Am I eligible?

You can apply for the UPC if you:

- are 16+ years old when the course starts
- are in the last year of high school when applying, or have already graduated
- do not have the qualifications to apply directly to a UCL undergraduate degree*

Academic requirements

We welcome students from all over the world and do not have a single set of academic entry requirements for the UPC.

We're looking for excellent grades on your school transcripts and list some examples of minimum grades for qualifications from several countries on our website.

English language requirements

You need to complete the IELTS for UKVI (Academic) or Pearson PTE Academic UKVI before applying.

Under 18?

If you are under the age of 18 at the point of enrolment, you should familiarise yourself with UCL's essential information for under 18s on the UPC website.

How to apply

There are three stages to the UPC application process:

- application form & supporting documents
- entrance tests
- interview

You must succeed at each stage to receive an offer.

Application form & supporting documents

- Fully completed application form (including personal statement)
- Copies of school transcripts
- An IELTS for UKVI (Academic) or PTE Academic UKVI
- Payment of application fee

If we require any further documentation, we will let you know. Further information is available on our website.

Entrance test(s)

If you have submitted a complete application form, including all required documents and you meet our minimum requirements, we'll contact you about the entrance test(s).

Which entrance test(s) will I take?

UPCH – all applicants take the compulsory Critical Thinking entrance test. If you intend to study the Mathematics optional subject, then you must also take the Mathematics entrance test.

UPCSE – you will take an entrance test in each of the two optional subjects you intend to study.

You can familiarise yourself with practice entrance tests from our website.

Interview

If you achieve 50% or above in your entrance test(s), a UPC admissions tutor will assess your application.

Their decision regarding an invitation to interview will consider all aspects of your application.

If you are selected for an interview, they will contact you to set up a day and time.

Your performance in the interview is important in our decision to offer you a place on the course.

Accommodation

Once you've accepted your UPC offer, you can apply for UCL accommodation.

If you meet the eligibility criteria and apply before the deadline, you will be prioritised for a place in accommodation.
