

WHY IS STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT IMPORTANT FOR TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH?

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT ADDS MANY BENEFITS TO TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH. ENGAGEMENT WITH THOSE WHO MAY BE IMPACTED OR WHO HAVE THE EXPERIENCE TO COMMENT ENSURES RESEARCH IS NOT ONLY FIT FOR PURPOSE BUT ALSO BETTER, RELEVANT, ACCEPTABLE, AND APPROPRIATE FOR SOCIETY'S NEEDS.

EVIDENCE SHOWS THAT RESEARCH DONE WITH, RATHER THAN TO OR FOR PATIENTS AND OTHER KEY STAKEHOLDERS, IS MORE LIKELY TO BE IMPLEMENTED, CREATING GREATER IMPACT ON HEALTH AND WELL-BEING, PARTICULARLY IF THESE STAKEHOLDERS ALSO HAVE AN ACTIVE ROLE IN THERAPY DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION.

THERE ARE VARIOUS MOTIVATIONS DRIVING ENGAGEMENT WITH KEY STAKEHOLDERS IN TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH. SOME OF THESE ARE:
